We also celebrated Pancake Day by hearing about celebrations around the world and how to make pancakes. Eating them was the most fun part!

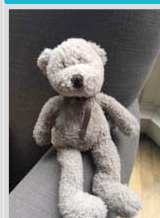


Our investigation trays have had pulses, grains and pasta in, but also the sand tray had insects to investigate with magnifying glasses
